Date	Concept Description	
	Etiquette: Introducing yourself, Saying "En Garde", Being kind.	Etiquette: Recognizing a good move, agreeing to touch rules.
	Setting up the pieces on the board. White square on the right.	When to say Check, Checkmate, or Stalemate, (Congratulations).
	Skewer with the queen or bishop.	Etiquette: Saying "En Garde", and check and being kind.
	Pin, reveled check, and multi-piece attack. (Review skewer).	Etiquette: Saying "Good Move" and accepting congratulations.
	Fork and revealed check and double check.	Etiquette in capturing a piece (one hand versus two hands).
	Checkmate with a king and pawn, also avoiding checkmate.	Etiquette with touch move rules (sitting on your hands).
	The end game and how to prepare for it.	Review the rules of etiquette for our club. (If one wants touch rules)
	Recording a game and recording and reporting the results.	Etiquette in reporting results to a tournament director.
	The opening game, defending and winning. (4 move checkmate)	The Etiquette of touch move rules.
	Double check checkmates, (using Knight and queen together).	Thanking Lewis and Clark for visiting us.
	The opening game, defending and winning. (4 move checkmate)	Review the Etiquette of touch move rules and allowing take backs.
	The best defense may be a strong offense, (Revealed check)	Etiquette and the psychology of bait.
